JESUS PROVES TO BE HIMSELF

TODAY'S GOSPEL READING

While the disciples were gathered, Jesus appeared. He said, "Peace be with you." At first, they were frightened, thinking that He was a ghost. Jesus could see they were afraid, He told them not to be. "Look at my hands and feet. Touch me and see me, because a ghost does not have a body." He asked for food and they gave Him fish. He took it and ate it in front of them. They were amazed. He spoke of the scriptures, so they may be reminded and understand better. He said, "It is written that the Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for all the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in His name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem, You are witnesses of these things, This is the Truth. Peace be with you."

Think About it: When Jesus says "This is the truth. Peace be with you." Does it remind you of anything?



After we read the gospel during mass the priest says this, because we have just read from the witnesses of the truth: the disciples. And the truth that Jesus speaks of in today's reading is that:

- 1.He is the messiah
- 2.He died for our sins
- 3.He is resurrected and alive
- 4. Because of that, we are forgiven
- 5. And the disciples are witnesses to this

Luke 24: 36-48

The disciples were afraid when Jesus first appeared to them after He died. They thought he might be a ghost. Jesus had to prove he was real.
